



Trail Etiquette

- Stay on the trails
- No snowshoeing/walking or dogs on groomed ski trails
- Dogs must be leashed
- Dog waste must be picked up and properly disposed
- Faster skiers will pass on the left & announce themselves
- Do not “skate” on/over set classic tracks
- Take out all trash with you
- No campfires
- The Arboretum is a non-smoking facility

Trails & Parking Fee

- Non-member daily use fee (includes parking) \$5.00
- Kids 15 and under \$1.00
- No charge for Arboretum members
- After-hours payments can be made at the drop box at the trailhead at the Visitor Center parking lot. The payment stub should be placed in your vehicle window.
- Restrooms are open until 10 pm - available on the west end of the visitor center.

Cross Country Ski Trails

The Great Minnesota State Cross Country Ski Pass is required to ski the trails at the Arboretum. The ski trails are part of the MN Grant-In-Aid trail system. Daily MN State ski passes can be purchased at the visitor center or any MN state license ELS location. Ski pass must be carried on skier at all times.

Snowshoe / Walking Trails

- An Arboretum membership or day pass is required to use the trail system.
- Do not walk on groomed ski trails. Snowshoeing is allowed “off trail”, but be aware of your location.

Legend

- Solid, colored lines represent ski trails
- Dotted lines represent snow shoe and walking trails
- The outer loop = about 1 hour & approx. 2 miles
- Acorn & Ojibwe are lit trails until 10 pm
- Rudy's & Big Ben - difficult trails with hills
- Beginner level

All distances are in kilometers and are measured between trail intersections

1km = .62 miles
